Child-led learning and play-based exploration underpin the teaching approach in Early Years and learning is supported through questioning, observation and reflection.

We value the importance of outdoor learning, giving our children direct contact with their natural environment and encouraging a healthy and active lifestyle. Our provision is equally equipped both indoors and outdoors providing superb continuous provision and allowing our children to flourish in this highly important developmental stage of their learning.

Our Early Years team are highly experienced and recognise that young minds are eager, inquisitive and ready to learn. We harness and hold in high regard, excellent relationships between children, families and teachers, helping children grow and develop into happy, healthy and confident individuals with positive outlooks on life and learning.













### SENIOR PREP

In terms of character development, the same emphasis and encouragement on independence, motivation, leadership and resilience is applied but geared now to children who are growing towards adolescence.

Our pupils begin and end the day with their form tutor, during which time, children are nurtured pastorally. From Year 5-8, all lessons are taught by subject specialists. Academically, our pupils have a developed sense of their strengths and indeed where they will benefit from support. Key to Terra Nova's offering is the guidance given by the school to pupils and their families in determining which is the right senior school be that at 11+ or 13+ entry. The breadth of curriculum means the school day finishes at 5pm as in addition to the core academic subjects, our students enjoy curriculum lessons in creative and performing arts as well as sport, Computer Science and STEAM projects.

## Y E A R 7 & 8

What is known as Key Stage 3 - Years 7&8 can be somewhat 'lost' years in senior schools as the focus is inevitably on GCSE and 'A'-level year groups. Whereas at Terra Nova, students in years 7&8 are the very best of the school. They are upheld as an example to the rest of the school as to the type of young women and men that the younger children should aspire to become. This responsibility is worn well and each year, a group of mature, outgoing, confident and 'comfortable in their own skin' students graduate from Terra Nova School destined for some of the leading day and boarding schools in the country.

Leadership at Terra Nova is a core part of pupil development and there are a wide range of opportunities offered, including Heads of School, House Captains, School Council and Sports Captains. Leadership is a vital life skill and assists our pupils in becoming articulate, confident and compassionate; all the attributes of a successful leader.





### BOARDING

There is a very special, homely feel to boarding at Terra Nova School.

Boarding at Terra Nova encourages pupils to live their lives to the full in as many areas as possible, allowing individuality to flourish whilst creating a great sense of belonging in our boarding community.

Our boarding staff know each child well and are committed to providing a happy, safe and settled family environment for all, allowing confidence and independence to develop. Boarders are kind, considerate of each other and always extremely welcoming to new members of their 'boarding family'.

Our boarders have access to the great range of facilities and resources at Terra Nova and are supported by our experienced staff body in all aspects of school life. Terra Nova boarders tend to excel in their academic studies whilst enjoying a wide range of activities which helps to develop their skills and characters and lay foundations for their successes in the future.

Terra Nova's boarding community is greatly enhanced by the blend of different countries and cultures from which our pupils originate. Diversity is respected and celebrated in the setting of a traditional British boarding school and we are proud that many life-long cross-continent friendships start within our Terra Nova dorms.





## CURRICULUM

#### & ACADEMICS

That a child should be both stretched and supported to achieve their full potential is what drives the school's academics. The small class sizes and the high ratio of teachers to pupils facilitate the focus on success in academics by enabling teachers to have an in depth knowledge of each child's abilities; their strengths and their weaknesses, where and when they are capable of more and where and when they need support. During a child's education at Terra Nova, the school is committed to:

- Igniting a deep rooted love of learning, at first, by laying down the foundations
- Instilling a deep rooted appreciation of the school's values.
- Equipping the child with a belief in their own self, an understanding of their ability and the responsibilities and knowledge of their role in a community that are in essence; skills for life.
- Preparing the child for their secondary school whether that is a day or boarding school.
- Celebrating success: The celebratory culture of the school is also very much in evidence. Pupils' successes in all areas: academic disciplines, sporting achievements, the creative arts, are encouraged and similarly to a child's demonstration of the school values, celebrated.

### SPORT

We aim for each pupil to achieve on a personal level and to develop their physical skills, as well as others such as confidence, self-esteem, respect, and teamwork.

Sport is an inclusive subject with all pupils being given the opportunity to represent the School, at a level appropriate to their ability, usually weekly. Fixtures are arranged with other Schools primarily on Wednesdays for Year 5 – Year 8 and Tuesdays for Year 3 and Year 4. It is an expectation that pupils will represent the School in fixtures/tournaments when they occur.









## CREATIVE

Pupils in Year 3 upwards enjoy specialist subject teaching in their Art lessons. Children experience working in both 2D and 3D using a variety of different mediums including clay, mosaic, textiles as well as paint and pencil. Art projects involve research of different artists, cultures, movements or events. Curriculum Art lessons take place each week, additionally children can access a number of after school Art clubs, as well as specialist scholarship sessions.

The Art department provides structured learning, balanced with space for personal exploration.

The accumulation of technical skills and contextual knowledge, balanced with growing self-awareness of what it is to be a creative being.

Our aim is to enable individual pupils to make appropriate choices regarding materials and processes and to be empowered towards making a personal, creative response.

## MUSIC & PERFORMING ARTS

Participation in Music is a fun and enjoyable experience for pupils at Terra Nova School. We aim for each pupil to achieve on a personal level whilst developing their music and performance skills, building confidence and self-esteem through collaboration with their peers.

Music and Performing Arts are fully inclusive with all pupils being given the opportunity to showcase their talent, in front of an audience on a number of occasions; in class concerts, termly concerts, house singing competitions and opportunities to sing in the community, particularly around Christmas and on other occasions throughout the academic year.

There are 3 school choirs, the Junior Choir for pupils in Years 1-4, the Senior Choir for pupils in Years 5-8 and the Chamber Choir for pupils in Years 7-8, membership is by invitation only.

There are a wide variety of instruments to learn as part of curriculum lessons, and individually with our visiting music teachers (VMTs). We also offer superb teaching in LAMDA Speech and Drama lessons.

## STEAM

STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics) STEAM plays an increasingly important role in the lives of pupils. Our aim is to provide pupils with the tools needed to prepare them for an ever-changing world. The STEAM curriculum in Senior Prep covers the following areas:

- Digital Literacy develops a student's ability to find, evaluate and compose information on a variety of platforms and software.
- Digital Safety aims to equip students with the skills to stay safe online and be responsible digital citizens.
- Coding and Robotics utilises different coding software to allow students to program virtual models and robotic devices.
- Use of the latest technology to enhance learning experiences is embedded throughout the curriculum.









The school building, a private home until 1939 comprises of a grand main house, a chapel and what were once farm buildings including stables, a tack room, a piggery and a dovecote. These beautiful old buildings have been adapted to accommodate the school as it is today.

We are proud to offer the children the following facilities:

- The Performing Arts Centre as well as being a theatre, this building doubles up as an indoor sports hall enabling after school clubs such as Judo and Gymnastics
- The private woodland in which is a cross country course, a stream and 3 outdoor classrooms
- The swimming pool which although small, enables children to learn to swim. Swimming is a popular boarding activity, after school, in the summer months
- Two Hubs otherwise known as libraries, one for children in Years I-8 is located in the heart of the school and all children spend one of their 5 English lessons in the Hub. The second one is located in the Reception classroom and is for the children in Nursery & Reception.
- The Makerspace this room is the location for coding and robotics, available to children in Year I upwards. Also home to our 3D scanner and printer.
- Art and Design Technology studios. Our laser cutter is just one of many exciting resources found within our creative department.
- The children in the Early Years enjoy plenty of time outside, nurturing the animals in their farm including Apple the Shetland pony and the black hens in Nursery and brown ones belonging to Reception. When not looking after the farm animals and enjoying woodland walks, the children in the Early Years enjoy the largest sand pit in Cheshire!





#### LOCATION

Terra Nova's 35-acre campus is located in the Cheshire countryside yet only 20 miles from the vibrant city of Manchester-providing our pupils and their families with the best of both worlds. London is easily accessible by train, 90 minute journey, from nearby Crewe Station and the nearby M6 motorway junction provides good links to the UK by road.

Our neighbouring village of Holmes Chapel is friendly and welcoming and we are proud of the established links Terra Nova has within the community.

Our outdoor spaces are attractive, green and spacious, whilst our mix of both historical and modern buildings provide a wealth of learning areas, facilities and social spaces for our pupils.

We are fortunate to consider the world famous Jodrell Bank Observatory, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, as one of our closest neighbours and our pupils enjoy the sight of this internationally renowned landmark in their daily view.

## DESTINATION

All pupils are encouraged to become inquisitive, independent learners who leave Terra Nova as happy and confident young people, able to achieve their potential and ready to take on the challenges of Senior School and beyond.

Terra Nova School feeds to a wide variety of senior schools, both day and boarding and at 11+ and 13+. Resultantly the preparation for senior schools is relatively individualised. This is exemplified specifically by the high number of scholarships Terra Nova pupils achieve to senior schools in varying disciplines. Additionally, the challenge of the Common Entrance curriculum (concluded with examinations in English, Maths, Biology, Physics Chemistry and French in the June of Year 8) provides an excellent and testing precursor to the GCSE curriculum.

In terms of day schools, we feed to all of the excellent day schools in the area, these include:

- The King's School, Macclesfield
- The Manchester Grammar School
- Withington Girls' School
- The Grange School
- Cheadle Hulme School
- Stockport Grammar School
- Sandbach Boys & Girls Schools

Our pupils are prepared for both 11+ and 13+ entrance examinations. In recent years we have sent a number of children to The Manchester Grammar School, The King's School, Macclesfield and The Grange School at 13+.

In terms of boarding schools, we feed to some of the leading schools in the country with the majority of children moving on to: Sedbergh, Shrewsbury & Repton. However, we have sent our children to the schools listed below in recent years:
