


LumiVoce Voices for the Planet Challenge Judging Criteria Create, Inspire, Act Saving all Life on Earth

Story Writing

Story is meaningful and relevant	The story does not quite relate to biodiversity (nature, environment, wildlife)	The story is related to biodiversity (nature, environment, wildlife) and makes its readers think	The story is creative and unique to do with biodiversity (nature, environment, wildlife) and carries a strong message. Readers feel compelled to act.
Characters	The characters need a little more detail and description	The characters have a good description and are well-chosen	The characters are brought to life through their expressions, personality, and descriptions.
Setting	The setting takes place in a setting that is not typical for that character, not very realistic. The entire story takes place in one setting.	The setting accurately represents where the story takes place and the writer makes use of more than one place in their setting to tell the story e.g. the river, the forest, etc.	The setting accurately represents where the story takes place. The plot of the story takes place in different settings and the writer uses very descriptive language to describe it.

LumiVoce Voices for the Planet Challenge Create, Inspire, Act Saving all Life on Earth

Challenge Rules

- 1. The illustrations/ stories and/or music must come under the theme 'Saving all Life on Earth' and include Biodiversity and Creativity. This means illustrations, stories or music encompassing wildlife, flora and wild habitats, animals, etc.
- 2. All facts must be checked and verified from a trusted source such as the WWF (World Wildlife Fund), UN (United Nations), TNC (The Nature Conservancy), etc.
- 3. All challenges must be completed by you! (You have permission to use Lumivoce's music stems/tracks to create your video/music; and you can download wildlife and nature sounds from royalty free online sources, BBC Archives Sound Bank http://bbcsfx.acropolis.org.uk/)
- 4. All challenges should be completed by the deadline, 22nd May (by 5pm Hong Kong Time) in order to be judged and selected.
- 5. Stories should be no longer than 600 words; there should be no less than 10 illustrations per book (no upper limit).
- 6. Music/music videos should be no less than 2 minutes long or longer than 5 minutes in length.
- 7. Each challenge should contain emotion and be compelling to convince readers/listeners that they can become Biodiversity Champions too!
- 8. Each challenge must show strong intention, purpose and message to the listener/reader, which encourages them to take action. Advantage would be given to projects that come with creative solutions to the challenges.
- 9. Stories/videos should be produced in English or English/Chinese (bilingual)
- 10. All participants should enjoy the challenge, be creative and have fun!
